Leading while Following, Or Getting Along While Speaking Truth to Power

Dean Jenness' empirical research has focused on prostitution, hate crime and prison violence to explore the links between deviance and social control. These efforts support the development of innovative law enforcement policy and training programs. This workshop will explore the apparently contradictory elements of leadership success: "going along to get along" and "speaking truth to power." Through her experience as a teacher, academic leader, administrator, and public policy expert, she will talk about the importance of personal efficacy to effective leadership and how the best leaders often follow, even as they lead.



Valerie Jenness is the Dean of the School of Social Ecology at UCI, as well as Professor of Criminology, Law and Society and Professor of Sociology. Her award winning research is significant and controversial, earning her media coverage, government consulting jobs and legal testimony opportunities. Her books and scholarly articles are highly cited and her teaching has been recognized with multiple awards.
